A Message from NACO Legal Counsel

To All County Board Chairs and Attorneys with Emails, County Clerks, Chief Administrative Officers, County Board Assistants,

Earlier this week on Wednesday, the U.S. Senate unanimously passed legislation to declare June 19th National Independence Day and the following day the U.S House of Representatives passed legislation with a vote of 415–14. This afternoon, President Biden is planning to sign the legislation.

This legislation may impact you and your county if your personnel policies reference following holidays declared by law. As stated in Roll Call, "Because it does not include an effective date, the law will take effective immediately. The Office of Personnel Management confirmed that in a Thursday morning tweet, saying "most federal employees will observe the holiday tomorrow, June 18th." In the tweet from the Office of Public Management, they stated:"

Today @POTUS will sign the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act, establishing June 19th as a federal holiday. As the 19th falls on a Saturday, most federal employees will observe the holiday tomorrow, June 18th.

According to Nebraska State Statute 84–1001 (3), "For purposes of this Section, paid holidays shall include all of the days enumerated in Neb. Rev. Stat. § 25–2221 and all days declared by law or proclamation of the President or Governor to be holidays." Exceptions may include law enforcement, security, military, and employees engaged in other essential functions, such as 24 hour facilities.

I hope this information is beneficial to you. If you have questions, please feel free to contact me.

I encourage you to review your personnel policies but more importantly, discuss this issue with your county attorney, if you have not already done so.


